

Think Zika

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1. IDENTIFY

2. TEST

3. REPORT



Ask the patient about travel to areas with Zika virus activity.




Ask if the patient or fellowtravelers became ill while traveling or during the two weeks after return, and reported two of the following:

FEVER RASH JOINT PAIN CONJUNCTIVITIS Order an ultrasound for a pregnant woman who has traveled during pregnancy. Order Zika virus testing if microcephaly or intracranial calcifications are present in the fetus.



For all travelers with symptoms, contact your local health office to request Zika virus testing.

Test for dengue and chikungunya if the patient or fellow-travelers reported fever.





Report any suspect
Zika, dengue, or
chikungunya cases to
your local health
office within one
business day to
ensure appropriate
confirmatory testing
and mosquito control.
